

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## Lesson Summaries

**Lesson 1:** Advantages of Free Market - Technology Leap - An Amazing technology leap followed the adoption of the Constitution and initiation of Free Market. Individuals are important and their freedom is dependent upon taking responsibility.

**Lesson 2:** Power Struggle – Ruler's Law/ Anarchy/ People's Law. A study of government is a study of power and who controls that power. The Founders wisely provided for rule by the people with a republic. The unquestioned truth is presented that the Constitution provided greater individual freedom than ever before.

**Lesson 3:** Founding Fathers - Declaration of Independence. Wise, true principles that were enumerated by the Founders in the Declaration of Independence are taught.

**Lesson 4:** Preamble - Articles I - VII. The purposes and proper roles of government as defined in the original Constitution are presented. Knowledge of the success of the founding documents will instill this pledge: "We will save our Constitution and keep a good thing going."

**Lesson 5:** Bill of Rights - Some Amendments. Emphasis is given to the fact that laws are designed to limit government. The truth will be emphasized that all rights reside first in the people and second in the sovereign states as declared in the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> amendments.

**Note:** The lessons contain **no discussion** of political parties, candidates, officials in office, or of current contentious subjects. CitC goal is to put aside politics and discover the documents.
